TRADITIONS - COMMUNION (PART 1)

NOTES | 4.18.21

Exodus 6:6-8 English Standard Version (ESV)

Say therefore to the people of Israel, 'I am the Lord, and I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, and I will deliver you from slavery to them, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with great acts of judgment. I will take you to be my people, and I will be your God, and you shall know that I am the Lord your God, who has brought you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians. I will bring you into the land that I swore to give to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob. I will give it to you for a possession. I am the Lord.'

4 Promises of the Exodus and the four cups:

- I will bring you out from under the yoke of slavery - The Cup of Sanctification
- I will free you from being slaves - The Cup of Deliverance
- I will redeem you - The Cup of Redemption
- I will take you as my people - The Cup of Protection

Luke 22:19 | ESV

And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

John 13:3-10 | ESV

Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going back to God, rose from supper. He laid aside his outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around his waist. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, do you wash my feet?" Jesus answered him, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but afterward you will understand." Peter said to him, "You shall never wash my feet." Jesus answered him, "If I do not wash you, you have no share with me." Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" Jesus said to him, "The one who has bathed does not need to wash, except for his feet, but is completely clean. And you are clean, but not every one of you."

And he took with him Peter and James and John, and began to be greatly distressed and troubled.

For in the hand of the Lord there is a cup
with foaming wine, well mixed,
and he pours out from it,
and all the wicked of the earth
shall drain it down to the dregs.

Psalms 69:24 | ESV

Pour out your indignation upon them,
and let your burning anger overtake them.

Psalm 79:6 | ESV

Pour out your anger on the nations
that do not know you,
and on the kingdoms
that do not call upon your name!

Jeremiah 25:15-16 | ESV

Thus the Lord, the God of Israel, said to me: “Take from my hand this cup of the wine of wrath, and make all the nations to whom I send you drink it. They shall drink and stagger and be crazed because of the sword that I am sending among them.”

Mark 14:36 | ESV

And he said, “Abba, Father, all things are possible for you. Remove this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will.”
