THE KINGDOM - THE GOSPEL

NOTES | 10.17.21

Exodus 8:16-19 | English Standard Version (ESV)

Then the Lord said to Moses, "Say to Aaron, 'Stretch out your staff and strike the dust of the earth, so that it may become gnats in all the land of Egypt.'" And they did so. Aaron stretched out his hand with his staff and struck the dust of the earth, and there were gnats on man and beast. All the dust of the earth became gnats in all the land of Egypt. The magicians tried by their secret arts to produce gnats, but they could not. So there were gnats on man and beast. Then the magicians said to Pharaoh, "This is the finger of God." But Pharaoh's heart was hardened, and he would not listen to them, as the Lord had said.

Luke 11:14-20 | ESV

Now he was casting out a demon that was mute. When the demon had gone out, the mute man spoke, and the people marveled. But some of them said, "He casts out demons by Beelzebul, the prince of demons," while others, to test him, kept seeking from him a sign from heaven. But he, knowing their thoughts, said to them, "Every kingdom divided against itself is laid waste, and a divided household falls. And if Satan also is divided against himself, how will his kingdom stand? For you say that I cast out demons by

Beelzebul. And if I cast out demons by Beelzebul, by whom do your sons cast them out? Therefore they will be your judges. But if it is by the finger of God that I cast out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon you.

Exodus 15:1 | ESV

Then Moses and the people of Israel sang this song to the Lord, saying,

- "I will sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously;
 - the horse and his rider he has thrown into the sea.

Exodus 15:20-21 | ESV

Then Miriam the prophetess, the sister of Aaron, took a tambourine in her hand, and all the women went out after her with tambourines and dancing. And Miriam sang to them: "Sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously;

the horse and his rider he has thrown into the sea."

Matthew 6:9-15 | ESV

Pray then like this: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

IMPLICATIONS

- 1. When we do hard things spiritually, we extend the rule and reign of God here on earth.
- 2. Living in the Kingdom of God is less about where we go to church and more about allowing God to rule in our hearts.
- 3. Our commitment to the Lord is best demonstrated in how we treat others.
- 4. When we are obedient and allow God to reign in our hearts, he expands his reign into the hearts of people around us. This is how we partner with the Kingdom.
